## Jon Stolzer of Canine Inc. Provides Tips to Stop Excessive Barking

A dog's way of communicating is with their bark. Excessive or loud, unwanted barking is not appropriate. There are all kinds of reasons why a dog barks. They may be alarming you that something is on or near their area. They do not like their space to be invaded. They could be trying to tell you they want attention and feel frustrated. Maybe they are just having fun. You would not want to train your dog to stop barking completely, but they can be taught to control unnecessary barking. This will increase your dog's ability to communicate with you if they learn to bark at the proper time. Here are a few tips by Expert Canine Behaviorist and Training Specialist, Jon Stolzer of Canine Inc., to help stop that excessive barking.

1. Making sure your dog gets enough exercise is just one way to keep the barking under control. Lack of exercise will cause poor conduct and if they are bored, they will bark more. Stimulation will curb the boredom and the barking.
2. Buy a clicker and use treats. Once you get your dog to stop barking, click the clicker and reward this positive behavior with a treat. This will make the dogs think that when they are quiet, good things happen.
